



January 26-February 18







September 27-October 26





It is then up to Gillette himself, as he assumes the persona of Holmes, to track down the killer before the next victim appears.

The Kunkels (the poor family living behind Mount St. Helen's School) have won the lottery and gifted the Sisters an all-expense-paid trip on the "Faiths of All Nations" cruise. After a week at sea, the ship runs into a storm. Several people become ill, including all of the actors in the ship's production of *Fiddler on the Roof*. (All except the actor playing Tevye, that is.) The captain of the ship, knowing of the Sisters' show biz savvy, requests that the Sisters and Tevye put on a revue.

Based on the 1954 Paramount Pictures film. Veterans Bob Wallace and Phil Davis have a successful song-and dance act after World War II. With romance in mind, the two follow a duo of beautiful singing sisters en route to their Christmas show at a Vermont lodge, which just happens to be owned by Bob and Phil's former army commander. White Christmas is an uplifting, wholesome musical that will delight audiences of all ages.
